Speaking with him showed a new side of veterinary medicine that was unbenonsted before. This shows a new driving force to become an orthopedic specialist, patient connection; operating in orthopedics will require less of a client connection and more a connection with the patient seeing as client do not typically see an orthopedic on a regular basis.
